1914. The Master of the Rolls decided that an Infant aged 16 could change his name and that although it might be voidable it was not void by reason of his age.

The Master of the Rolls directed that all deeds poll of change of name must be advertised in the London Gazette after Enrolment.

The following directions were given by Sir John Macdonell in 1917 - 1918

1. In the case of infahts under the age of 10 years the change of name must be made in his behalf by his parent or legal Guardian.

If made by an Infant between the ages of 10 and 16 years, a consent by the parent or Guardian to the change must be endorsed upon the deed poll. Infants of 18 years of age may be allowed to change their names without such consent.

2. No deed poll to be enrolled for any person residing permanently in a Foreign Country although

claiming to be a British Subject.

Pritish subject residing
permanently in any part of the
British Dominions out of the
Jurisdiction of the High Court
except Scotland and Ireland.
